

Curriculum Update

<u>Math</u>: In math this week, we began our order of operations unit. Students have been provided a mini-anchor chart (note sheet) with the PEMDAS process on it. Many students have been using this daily as a tool to help them when solving expressions. On Wednesday, the class practiced simplifying equations that had a variety of grouping symbols in them. Students had the opportunity to work on various practice problems with partners. On Thursday and Friday, we analyzed expressions in word form and practiced writing these correctly. It is important that your child understands the various names used for each operation.

Reading: In reading, this week, the students were introduced to the fantasy unit. They have learned the elements of fantasy and how this genre helps teach students a deeper meaning to life and the lessons we learn from existing. On Monday, they completed a card sort. They read various statements and determined if the idea could or could not happen. On Wednesday, they read an excerpt from Peter Pan and had to identify the fantasy elements and provide examples of how these elements depicted the genre of fantasy. We began our whole class novel, The Phantom Tollbooth. This text will be used throughout the unit to reinforce the mini-lesson skills being taught. In writing, students are gaining foundational skills for writing their own fantasy. We've spent a lot of time this week talking about critical characters, settings and objects and how author's strategically plan when to stop the action in order to describe one or more of these critical parts of the narrative.

Social Studies: In social studies, the students are learning about government. To begin the unit, they developed a background of 4 major types of government. They worked as teams to determine the best and worst type of government using evidence from the texts they read. We then learned about the Articles of Confederation. Students watched a Brainpop video and completed a Star graphic organizer to demonstrate what they learned about this document. On Thursday, they completed a close read on this topic and read a skit of Shay's Rebellion and an article from the Maryland Gazette. We will continue this unit for the next two weeks.

OBJECTIVES



I Can Statements:

I Can... In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with your student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

• use parentheses, brackets and braces to simplify an expression.

Reading:

• Determine a theme of a story, drama, or poem from details in the text, including how characters in a story or drama respond to challenges or how the speaker in a poem reflects upon a topic; summarizes the text.

Writing:

• Write fantasy writing pieces that integrate the elements of a fantasy

Social Studies:

Understand different forms of government and can explain the beginning documents that were designed after the American Revolution.
