### Raleigh Police LEAD Program

This week we began our weekly class with Raleigh Police Department Officer, Jeremy Thompson. The sessions will range from peer pressure, bullying, drugs, and gangs. These sessions began on January 28th and will continue throughout the remainder of the quarter. If you have any questions let me know.

# **Curriculum Update**

Math: In Math this week our students continued their study of adding and subtracting decimals. Prior to track out students had solved problems using decimal notation and the standard algorithm. This week students were shown a visual number line model that allowed them to see the problems in a more concrete manner. Students also practiced decomposing decimals (.39 = .3 + .09) to easily add numbers on the number line. This <u>video</u> shows number line models in more detail. Next week we will continue our study of decimals. In the next few weeks we will be studying fractions. Students also completed their second NC check in on Friday. Results from this assessment will be available to teachers in the coming weeks.

Reading: In Reading this week, students began their third quarter unit of study, athletes as leaders of social change. To begin students participated in a mystery quote protocol. After examining quotes relating to various athletes including Jackie Robinson, we were introduced to our new text, "Promises to Keep" by Sharon Robinson, Jackie Robinson's daughter. We spent our first day reading the first few pages of the text for the gist. Before diving deeper into our study of Jackie, we examined segregation, slavery, and Jim Crow laws. We then found main ideas and supporting details for this portion of the text. Finally, at the end of the week we practiced crafting summaries of the text. Next week we will continue our study of Jackie Robinson and breaking the color barrier in Major League Baseball.

Social Studies/Science: In Social Studies this week our students began their new unit of economics. We began the unit by learning about market, command, and traditional economies. We then reviewed various labels of products and noticed that many items are made in various countries. We then discussed trade and the impact it has upon the United States. We reviewed our largest trade partners and answered questions pertaining to trade. Next, we delved further into production by learning about the key concepts of supply and demand. We will continue our study of economies next week.
