READvolution

We are partnering with the Carolina Hurricanes again this year for READvolution, a program to get students reading more each day. Students can log into their WAKEID portal at wakeid.wcpss.net and log the books and minutes each day from **September 30- November 22nd**. We are excited to announce that the Carolina Hurricanes will continue to award students who achieve the reading goal of **20 minutes per day** throughout the allotted time frame (for a total of 800 minutes) two complimentary ticket vouchers to a Hurricanes home game. Students can go back and choose a past date and log the book read and minutes read starting on September 30th.

Our school goal is to read 2,020 BOOKS collectively. After a student finishes a book, they can put a hockey puck on our banner outside of the Croc Commons. Students can receive a hockey puck from their classroom teacher or in the Media Center when they have finished reading a book. Help us reach our goal!

Logging into READvolution to complete your reading logs:

Students must log into the WakeID portal at wakeid.wcpss.net. Once logged into their portal, they will see the READvolution application. Students must add a book title first and then complete the reading log by selecting which book they read, how many minutes, and if they completed the book. (Don't check completed book until you have finished reading it. It won't allow you to select that book again after you check completed).

3rd-5th Grade- All students know how to log into their portal. If your students has any question they can see their classroom teacher for their WakeID or to reset their password.

<u>Math</u>: On Monday, your child completed a multiplying fractions assessment. You will be able to find this in your child's Friday folder. Please have them review their mistakes and to come see me if they have any questions. Following this assessment, the students completed their NC check in on Tuesday. We were able to get back into our normal math routine Wednesday with a study relating division equations to fractions. They worked on a variety of activities Thursday and Friday to reinforce this new skill.

<u>Reading:</u> In Reading this week we continued our study of text structure. The students read a web article titled "Rainforests and Why they are Important." They learned a great deal of information about the rainforest. They compared the structure of this text with a part of the book we are reading "The Most Beautiful Roof in the World." Being able to think critically about text structure helps the student understand the information the author is trying to convey. By the middle of the week, the students were using what they have learned to begin formulating inferences related to our guiding question: "Why do scientist study the rainforest?" The students will begin gathering their research to participate in a Science Talk next week.

<u>Social Studies/Science</u>: This week in science the students learned about the 7 life processes. You can find notes on this in your child's binder. This will be helpful as he/she is studying for their next test. Students also learned about multi-cellular and unicellular organisms. On Thursday, they were introduced to the nervous system. Notes for this are in your child's binder. Please encourage your student to study for their next assessment which will be early next week and will cover cells. Stay up to date by watching the Dojo videos, pictures and messages.

I Can... In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with your student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

I can Compare and contrast the overall structure (e.g., chronology, comparison, cause/effect, problem/solution) of events, ideas, concepts, or information in two or more texts.
