READvolution

We are partnering with the Carolina Hurricanes again this year for READvolution, a program to get students reading more each day. Students can log into their WAKEID portal at wakeid.wcpss.net and log the books and minutes each day from September 30- November 22nd. We are excited to announce that the Carolina Hurricanes will continue to award students who achieve the reading goal of 20 minutes per day throughout the allotted time frame (for a total of 800 minutes) two complimentary ticket vouchers to a Hurricanes home game. Students can go back and choose a past date and log the book read and minutes read starting on September 30th.

Our school goal is to read 2,020 BOOKS collectively. After a student finishes a book, they can put a hockey puck on our banner outside of the Croc Commons. Students can receive a hockey puck from their classroom teacher or in the Media Center when they have finished reading a book. Help us reach our goal!

Logging into READvolution to complete your reading logs:

Students must log into the WakeID portal at wakeid.wcpss.net. Once logged into their portal, they will see the READvolution application. Students must add a book title first and then complete the reading log by selecting which book they read, how many minutes, and if they completed the book. (Don't check completed book until you have finished reading it. It won't allow you to select that book again after you check completed).

3rd-5th Grade- All students know how to log into their portal. If your students has any question they can see their classroom teacher for their WakelD or to reset their password.

Curriculum Update

Math: In Math this week our students have continued working on dividing unit fractions by whole numbers and dividing unit fractions by whole numbers. Students practiced using models and other methods to determine the quotient of expressions. Students also worked with partners and played a tic-tac-toe game that required them to solve various fraction division word problems. Often times when dividing the unit fractions our students are able to correctly calculate the quotient. However, the word problem can give students some difficulty as they become unsure which number should be the dividend and which should be the divisor.

Reading: In Reading this week our students continued their study of rainforests. Last week our students completed a practice science talk based upon notes that had collected throughout the quarter. This week we began collecting research based upon our new research question, "What Can I Do to Save the Rainforest?" After reading a book titled, "Seeds of Change". Students utilized various websites provided by EL and graphic organizers to collect the information they found. Students then utilized this research to have a graded science based discussion. It was very insightful to listen to all of the ideas students had about ways we can help save the rainforest.

Social Studies/Science: This week in science the students learned about the 7 life processes. You can find notes on this in your child's binder. This will be helpful as he/she is studying for their next test. Students also learned about multi-cellular and unicellular organisms. On Thursday, they were introduced to the nervous system. Notes for this are in your child's binder. Please encourage your student to study for their next assessment which will be early next week and will cover cells. Stay up to date by watching the Dojo videos, pictures and messages.
