Curriculum Update

Math: In math this week, we worked through various activities to demonstrate our ability of using a coordinate grid system to solve real world problems. The students completed their assessment which can be found in his/her Friday folder this week. We moved into our next unit multiplying decimal numbers. Students have been given two strategies to use for solving these multiplication problems. We will continue with this unit when we return from Thanksgiving break.

Reading: In reading, students continued to practice using strategies for discovering the main idea and supporting details of a non-fiction text. They were given an assessment on this which you will find in next week's folder. We moved into text structure and discussed how author's intentional use organizational structure to convey the information to their audience. The class seems to understand this and continues to practice identifying the various structures. They were provided an information page that shows all the styles, key words and sample graphic organizers that can be used for each kind. Please ask them about this. Finally, we looked at how standardized test makers design test questions to ask main idea questions. This is helpful in determining what strategies they can utilize for finding this information. I hope to continue this same concept with other reading standards.

Science: You will find your child's skeletal, muscular and nervous system assessment in their Friday folder. Please encourage your son/daughter to review the test and see me if they have any questions. Students then learned about the cardiovascular and respiratory system. They have Nearpod notes to accompany what they have learned. Additionally, they learned how the respiratory system works and have a diagram in their binder to show you. They should be able to explain how this system works in helping us breathe. We will take our final test the week they return. Don't worry, it won't be given on Monday, but most likely will be planned for Tuesday. If you have any questions please let me know.

I Can Statements:

I Can... In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with your student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

- Categorize and sort geometric shapes based upon a shape's attributes.
- Form ordered pairs and graph them on a coordinate grid.
- Multiply whole numbers by decimals using concrete models.

Reading:

- Make inferences using information from the text.
- Use the main idea from an informational text to craft a summary.
- Compare and Contrast the overall structure of a nonfiction text.

Writing:

- Write opinion writing pieces that utilize clear reasons and concrete evidence from sources

Science

- Understand the seven major body systems
