Math: In math this week and last week we have been learning about different strategies for multiplying and dividing decimals. You'll find our most recent assessment for multiplying decimals in your students' Friday Folder. We have focused primarily on dividing this week and learning about three types of division problems. First we learned about dividing whole numbers by decimals. Students completed a thinglink activity to show their understanding and learn some more about the concept. We then moved onto dividing decimals by decimals. The attached <u>link</u> illustrates how we have used grids to solve these problems. The final type of division we learned about was dividing decimals by whole numbers. This type of problem seemed to give our students the most trouble. This link details how we can use base ten pieces to assist in solving these problems. We will continue this unit next week and wrap it up with a quiz.

<u>Reading</u>: In reading, we have been working on differing accounts of the same topic also known as perspective. We began by reviewing several articles written by different authors about the same topic. We learned how authors can take a position and provide their evidence. Next, we continued our study of the Revolutionary War while continuing their study of perspective. To do this we examined a "crime scene" of the Boston Massacre. We reviewed the evidence and read multiple perspectives related to colonists, British Generals, and former slaves to dig deeper into what the witnesses felt happened at the event. By doing this students are examining the differing accounts that were given during this time period. We will continue to look at perspective next week with the Revolutionary War. In Writing, students are wrapping up their second opinion writing piece for the quarter. I am very intrigued by the topics I am seeing from "Should students be allowed to play tackle football?" to "Should Vaccines be required?" I anxiously await grading and reviewing their reasons and causes for their arguments.

<u>Social Studies:</u> In Social Studies, we have been incorporating our study of the Revolutionary War from Reading. Students have been working in small group/partner completing a google slides presentation about significant battles, individuals, and causes of the Revolutionary War. Ask your students about their progress on this project. We will wrap this up next week.
