
5th Grade Service Project

<u>Math</u>: This week in math our students built on their understanding of place value with an introduction into decimals. We used place value charts, money and base 10 manipulatives to conceptualize decimal place value. Your child has a place value chart that he/she can use on homework and classwork. In class, students played games to become familiar with the place value system. They practiced writing decimal numbers in standard form and word form. Your child practiced comparing decimals on Thursday and on Friday the class learned how to write decimal's in expanded form. I've suggested that students memorize the place value chart, so that they can replicate it on a future assessment.

Reading: In Reading this week we took our Mid-unit assessment for unit 2 where students demonstrated their understanding of figurative language. They were also asked to demonstrate what the figurative language helped them understand. This will be found in your child's Friday folder next week. On Tuesday, the students were introduced to concrete language and sensory details within their text. We completed a language dive that helped students better understand the meaning of a complex section of <u>The Most</u> Beautiful Rooftop in the World. I've been using our ALL block time to complete your child's MClass benchmark for mid-year. We will pick up with our normal ALL block schedule next week. Our students continued to work with their enrichment groups. Students seem to be enjoying the intervention. As mentioned in last week's newsletter, students may have several different teachers depending on their individual needs. Your students have either been working with myself, Mrs. Sumner, Mrs. Halychyn, or Mrs. Edmister. Each class is working on varying content and activities. Multiple texts can be found at www.biguniverse.com . Our students should know their log in, if you have any questions let me know.

<u>Social Studies/Science</u>: In science this week, we finalized our human body unit. Your child has been given 2 options for their final project. This is due next Friday and detailed information for each project is accessible from your child's Google Classroom. Please ask him/her about this. On Friday, students completed their final assessment. You will find this in your child's Friday folder next week.
