It is close to that wonderful time in fifth grade when students will learn about <u>Human Growth and</u>

Student Led Conferences

On March 16th from 3:45-6:45, track four will have their student lead conferences. This will be an excellent opportunity to discuss your students' progress with them and witness many of the strategies we utilize in class. In approximately one week, I will be sending out a signup genius email in which you will be able to sign up for a 30 minute time slot.

Our final field trip will be coming up very soon. On March 23rd, we will be embark on a learning experience at the Poe Health Center. This trip will coincide with our Human Growth and Development Lessons. The trip will cost \$5, the form will be in Friday folders this week, and the money will be due on March 3.

Middle School Transition

On Wednesday, February 8^{th} , I sent an email letter from Mr. Zelski regarding transition information to middle school. In a couple weeks, Wednesday, March 8^{th} , representatives from Pine Hollow will be coming to the school (during specials) to provide students with information that will be a helpful overview of what to expect in middle school.

Curriculum Update

<u>Math</u>: In math this week we completed our study of patterns and graphing patterns, we also completed our assessment on this concept. Be on the lookout for this in our Friday folders this week. After we completed our graphing and numerical table unit we began our study of fractions. As I told the students on Wednesday a very large portion of the remainder of our year will involve fractions. Our first area of study will be recognizing that a fraction is actually the division of the numerator by the denominator. For example if I had a candy bar and I were to share it with two friends I would take the one candy bar and split it in three. The equation would be $1 \div 3$ and each student would get 1/3 of the candy bar. This is a skill that can be somewhat confusing for students in word problem form. For example, if Sally had 7 meters of rope and she wanted to make 11 bracelets how long would each bracelet be? Well you would take the 7 meters of rope and divide it by 11. The equation would be $7 \div 11$ and each bracelet would be 7/11 meters long.

Reading: In reading this week we continued our genre study of fantasy. We began to dig deeper into the theme of fantasy stories. We began by discussing the two ways that we could think about theme. One way we could think of theme is as a "bumper stick" or common phrase. For, example, "the early bird gets the worm". However, we could also think of themes in a broader sense, such as friendship, courage, determination, etc. After discussing how to view a theme we looked at several proverbs and fables. We discussed the meaning of common proverbs and students picked a proverb and collaborated with partners to determine its meaning. We also discussed how examining a characters interactions can tell us more about the character by making inferences about the character based on their response. In strategy groups, we read a science fiction fantasy book about two young people learning to work together. We learned quite a bit about these characters by further examining their responses and interactions.

<u>Writing</u>: In writing this week, we continued our study of fantasy writing. Students learned about creating fantasy settings through mini lessons and read a louds in class. We also examined the effect of magical objects within stories by reading "*Sylvester and the Magic Pebble*". We then discussed how magical objects can be brought to life within our own fantasy stories.

Social Studies/Science: This week in Social Studies, we completed our study of the United States government and historical documents. On Monday, students created unique board games relating to their understanding of the three branches of government. Next, we discussed and reviewed the Bill of Rights. On Friday, students learned about what it means to be a United States citizen. Students were then assigned their final social studies project which will be due on February 17th. Students were given the assignment and rubric on their google classroom page. Also, in the coming weeks we will be starting our ecosystems unit. For this unit we will need clear two liter bottles. We will need quite a few so you may begin sending them in now.
