## Curriculum Update

Math: Students took their final pattern assessment last Thursday. This can be found in your child's Friday folder. Please review this with your child and save it for practice as they review for the EOG. On Tuesday, we were introduced to fractions. Students learned that fractions are simply a division of the numerator by the denominator. This concept is difficult for some, so it is important that they ask for help when they need it. We analyzed fractions and sorted these based on the following benchmarks: $0,1 / 2,1,>$ 1. After our sorting, students wrote rules that helped them estimate answers to addition and subtraction problems. Next, we began adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators on Friday.

Reading: In reading this week, we continued our theme unit. Students are encouraged to utilize their understanding of character interactions in order to analyze what the theme of a text. By the end of the week, the students were comparing texts with similar themes. I can't stress enough the importance of implementing the graphic organizers/strategies we use to learn these skills when they are completing multiple choice questions. Our daily 5 choices are designed to support their learning of these topics covered in our mini lessons. Therefore the importance that they are completing these choices daily. In writing, we continue to work on strategies to improve their fantasy stories. Students are completing their drafts and began working on their conclusion. Be sure to ask your student about their progress.

Social Studies: We finished our government unit this week. Students reviewed their board games and completed discussing the different branches of government and the Bill of Rights. Next, we began talking about citizenship and what it means to be a citizen of the United States. With that we discovered the importance of participating in our civic duties such as voting. We then discussed how the Electorial College system is used to determine our President. Next, we concluded our unit by learning how a bill becomes a law.

## OBJECTIVES



I Can Statements:

I Can... In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with your student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

- interpret a fraction as a division of the numerator by the denominator
- use benchmarks to estimate the sum and difference of two fractions.

Reading:

- Determine a theme of a story, drama, or poem from details in the text, including how characters in a story or drama respond to challenges or how the speaker in a poem reflects upon a topic; summarizes the text.

Writing:

- Write fantasy writing pieces that integrate the elements of a fantasy

Social Studies:

- Understand different forms of government and can explain the beginning documents that were designed after the American Revolution.
