Curriculum Update

Math: This week in math we practiced adding/subtracting fractions. Students are being encouraged to think conceptually about their math in order to enhance their problem solving ability. Ask your child about the "I think/I wonder" activity we've been using in class. On, Wednesday, we practiced adding and subtracting fractions with unlike denominators. The week was rounded out with lessons on how to add/subtract mixed numbers using models and number lines. Students will connect the models and number lines to the standard algorithm next week.

Reading: In Reading this week we continued our study of Jackie Robinson and continued reading more from our text "Promises to Keep" while noting factors that led to Jackie's success. We were introduced to a new Factor of Success: Communicating a Vision by focusing on Jackie Robinson's awards and recognitions. On Thursday, students worked in collaborative groups to create a timeline for the "Play Ball" section of Promises to Keep. Using the information they gathered, they completed a summary of this section in the text. Students will complete the End of Unit Assessment on Tuesday.

Social Studies/Science: Your student finished up their social studies unit last week. Students learned about savings and long and short term savings goals. They also played a budgeting game in which they had to create a budget based upon cards that were drawn. Next week students will begin their third quarter science unit relating to ecosystems. We are in need of clear 2 liter bottles for our terrariums and aquariums.
