## Science Expo

The Sycamore Creek science expo will take place on February 11, 2017. $5^{\text {th }}$ grade students are required to complete a science project. Although, they are not required to partake in the science expo, those that do participate will receive a homework pass and valuable experience. Classroom science projects are due on February $10^{\text {th }}$. Several weeks ago in Friday folder there was a flyer and a rubric for the project. ## Curriculum Update

Math: In Math this week we continued discussing order of operations involving expressions. On Monday we reviewed and wrapped up our mini unit on order of operations and expressions using brackets, braces, and parenthesis. After completing our assessment on Wednesday, we started our next mini unit, using patterns from word problems to form data tables. We then utilized the data tables to form ordered pairs and graphed our collected data. Students have been very confident with this concept, however they need to be sure to take their time and double check the points and use a ruler to form straight and precise lines. For more information about the numerical patterns lessons we have been completing please reference this parent letter. Next week we will begin discussing fractions.

Reading: In Reading this week, we continued our new unit related to fantasy. This week we have been examining character interactions within fantasy stories. We listened to several fantasy read aloud picture books while paying close attention to the interactions of the main character. By looking closer at our character's interactions and responses we are able to think about what their responses tell us about the character. When reading "Bad Case of Stripes", the main character Camilla was embarrassed by her appearance and was sensitive to what her peers were saying about her.
This evidence from the text allowed us to see that Camilla is self-conscious and concerned about what others think of her. This will lead us into what we will be discussing next, theme. If we pay attention to the main characters we are able to learn from them, this is often the theme or lesson the author is attempting to convey. For example, in the "Bad Case of Stripes", Camilla learned that it is okay to be different. By looking closely at what the character learns we can determine that the theme is "be yourself". Next week we will continue to look at fantasy stories and look more closely at the theme within texts.

Writing: In Writing this week, we started to brainstorm on fantasy stories, specifically our main characters and the setting of the story. Students read a story and completed a graphic organizer noting character strengths, weaknesses, behaviors and motivations. Students then began to think about the characters that they envisioned noting the same criteria listed above. To continue to get their creativity flowing, we completed a fantasy prompt on Wednesday. I was really excited to listen to our students' unique ideas. Next, week we will continue our fantasy prewriting.

Social Studies/Science: This week in social studies our students completed and presented their Constitution social studies projects. Each groups' ideas were well thought out and expressed their understanding of the article they were assigned. On Wednesday and Thursday we learned about the three branches of government and separation of power. After gaining an understanding of each branches' unique power, students were assigned a short project. In this project students created a board game using trivia from each of the legislative, judicial, and executive branches of government. Also, in the coming weeks we will be starting our ecosystems unit. For this unit we will need clear two liter bottles. We will need quite a few so you may begin sending them in now.
