## Curriculum Update

Math: This week we have been reviewing the fraction skills we learned prior to track-out. We have been solving real world problems involving each of the four operations. Most students are able to solve the expressions, however as a class we are at times struggling to determine the correct operations needed to solve fraction word problems. To help students we have done many different sample problems and we have played several interactive tic-tac-toe style games. We will continue to work on these skills through the remainder of the year, but I encourage you to assist you student in finding the correct operation needed.

Reading: In reading and writing this quarter we have shifted away from fictional texts and will begin studying non-fiction texts. In Writing our main focus/goal for the end of the quarter will be a research project related to the Civil War. To begin our study we reviewed several illustrations related to the Civil War. Students learned how to make observations related to primary source documents utilizing sentence starters. Next, we reviewed a couple of articles related to causes of the Civil War. Students then utilized several note taking strategies they learned in class, such as box and bullets and annotating the text. To annotate students utilized track marks that we have used previously this year. Taking notes on this topic will be extremely important when we begin drafting our research report. Ask your student to see their notes and annotation.

Social Studies/Science: In Social studies our learning has mirrored that of reading and writing with an introduction to the Civil War. To begin we viewed a couple of
BrainPop videos that examined the causes of the Civil War and the main events. Students completed several graphic organizers including vocabulary charts and maps that displayed the different states involved in the war. We also read and gathered information about westward expansion prior to the Civil War.
