## Curriculum Update

Math: We continued working through the volume unit. Students have mastered using the volume formula and learned how to use the area of the base of a rectangular prism and multiply it by the height. We've had discussions about this method and to remember that when the base is given, they will only multiply it with the height. They are also able to use problem solving skills in order to determine any missing measurements when given the volume. ON Friday, the students learned how to visualize composite figures and decompose these in order determine the volume of the rectangular prism. Your child will be formally assessed on this next week.

Reading: Students have been exposed to rigorous Civil War texts. They have been learning how to integrate information from multiple texts to answer questions that required students to synthesize what they have learned. We have had some great conversations around this topic and students have learned about many influential historical figures that risked their lives during this time period for the justice of others. In writing, the learners are asking research-based questions to assist them in finding information to write their research report. Students will also be creating a newspaper about their topic next week. Students will 'jazz' up their newspapers with some editorials and ads.

Science: In science, students learned all about the rain shadow effect and demonstrated their understanding by building a model and labeling. On Wednesday, students took their first assessment. This will be in their Friday folder for next week. We began our next micro unit of weather: Global/Local winds and Ocean currents. It's important that students are reviewing their vocabulary nightly.


I Can Statements:
