

Curriculum Update

<u>Math</u>: In Math this week we have continued discussing volume. We completed a project in which students had to design a greenhouse that would grow fruits and vegetables for healthy lunches. Students were provided a set volume of 900 cubic feet, they then had to find possible lengths, widths, and heights that were reasonable. While completing this projects we learned about <u>geometrical nets</u>. Students were very creative and did a great job. Upon the project's completion, students did a "gallery walk" to observe each groups projects. Next, students learned about volume word problems. Students practiced solving various types of problems with partners they also wrote volume related word problems. On Friday we began discussing <u>composite figures</u>.

Reading: In reading this week we continued our study of informational texts through our examination of the Civil War. Students learned the importance of digging deeper into a text especially while looking for the main idea. We also took some time to practice some EOG style questions. We will continue to do this for the remainder of the quarter. On Thursday, we looked at "Big Questions" to help us further engage an informational text. To help us do this, we utilized a nearpod activity about the battle of Gettysburg. While working through the nearpod students had the opportunity to pause and answer the "big questions" after reading a paragraph. Mr. T also continued our newest read aloud Elijah of Buxton. In writing, students continued researching a Civil War topic of their choice. Students were taught the importance of using multiple sources when researching a topic. Students did this by engaging texts from different authors while working with partners. As partner groups they discussed the differences of the authors' points of view and the differences in the information that was presented.

Science: In science, this week, the students finalized their second mini unit on the human body. On Monday, they watched a video on the skeletal and muscular system that gave them an understanding of how these two systems work together. We then moved into a study of the nervous system. The students completed a Nearpod and took notes on this system in order to prepare for the assessment given on Friday. Students participated in several illusions alongside a video in the Nearpod lesson. We were all pretty blown away with how these tricked us into believe things that were not really occurring. On Wednesday they participated in a lab testing their reaction time. Be sure to ask them all about this. On Friday, they took a test on the skeletal, muscular and nervous system. You will find this in their Friday folder next week! We will start our second mini unit on Monday with a focus on the respiratory and circulatory systems.
