Curriculum Update

Math: This week in math, we wrapped up our volume unit with a study on composite figures. Students seemed to grasp the concept of decomposing rectangular prisms in order to find the total volume of 3 dimensional shapes. They were given the final test on this unit Tuesday. Be on the lookout for this in Friday folders On Wednesday, we began our measurement unit. Throughout this unit, students will need to be able to convert within the customary and metric unit of measurements. It is also important that students are able to visualize benchmarks when determining the most appropriate unit of measure. On Thursday, we rotated through 7 stations which allowed students practice with measuring and converting measurements. We will continue this unit through next week.

Reading: We've continued to dig deeper into the Civil War with our mini lessons and daily 5 activities. Students learned how to take notes on information that they have read in an article. I expressed to the students that these mini lessons offer them a variety of tools to process the information they are learning. It is not my intention to require them to use EVERY strategy they are offered. I want them to find something that works for them and continue using it for comprehension and gather information for their research. We also learned how to effectively present information to an audience. Students are working in groups to present information from their integrated projects in Google. Students also completed a short quiz using EOG style questions that related to informational/non-fiction texts. This is also in Friday folders. In writing, I've been pulling students to review their research and am helping them plan and organize their ideas. Please ask your child about their research topic.

<u>Science</u>: In science this week, the students started their next mini unit on the circulatory/respiratory system. They have notes on the circulatory system that were taken from a fun nearpod activity. These can be used to help prepare them for the next test as well as their upcoming EOG.
