Curriculum Update

Math: In math this week, the students (temporarily) wrapped up our fraction unit with an assessment. After grading these tests, it is clear that word problem remediation needs to occur. Therefore, I will begin using our morning work time and some of strategy group time to assist students in being able to apply strategies that will help them understand how to solve a word problem with more confidence. It is highly encouraged that all students are practicing this skill using Moby Max. On Tuesday, we moved into the Volume unit. Students explored a variety of rectangular prisms using snap cubes. On Wednesday, the students created two different rectangular prisms with notebook paper and filled them with popcorn to determine if they had the same volume. These investigations have helped the class understand the definition of volume and the dimensions associated with volume. We will continue to practice solving for the volume of various rectangular prisms as well as complex prisms too.

Reading: Our study of the Civil War continued this week. Students are learning different strategies to help them understand non-fiction text with more accuracy. It is important that they practice one of these strategies when they are reading non-fiction articles. During our Daily 5 choice time, students read the latest edition of Time for Kids and completed 3 activities of their choice. These can be found and accessed through your child's Google Docs. We will continue to do something of this nature next week. Furthermore, students worked in strategy groups to review and practice appropriate test taking strategies to check and review the questions they missed on their Case 21 test. Many students are finding this to be helpful! Mr. T also started our newest read aloud Elijah of Buxton. In writing, students began researching a Civil War topic of their choice. Please check in with them about this.

<u>Science</u>: In science, students took their first assessment. This will be in their Friday folder this week. They will take a test after each mini-unit. We are currently learning about the muscular system. Next week, we will begin studying the skeletal system and wrap up with the nervous system. On Wednesday, the class took notes on the muscular system and then broke off into groups to complete some more learning about this impressive body system. Be sure to ask them about the reading, video slide show and lab. They should be able to explain the difference between the 3 types of muscles as well as the 2 types of muscle movement.

• I can apply my understanding of the 7 life processes to explain how multicellular and unicellular organisms are both living.
