

Curriculum Update

Math: In math this week, the students continued their last and final 5th grade math unit, geometry. Students completed their poster displaying their hierarchy diagrams and presented them on Friday. Students also began their EOG review by taking notes and solving problems on white boards. This week we focused on adding, subtracting, dividing, and multiplying fractions. Multiplying fraction word problems seem to give the students the most trouble, students were given a quizizz code with quite a few multiplication of fraction word problems on Wednesday. On Thursday and Friday we began reviewing place value and adding, subtracting, multiplying and dividing decimals.

Reading: This week in reading, students worked on the final part of their performance task. Students completed their emergency preparedness pamphlet/leaflet with a partner or individually. Next, our students began crafting their notes for their PSA presentation. Students began practice their presentations on Thursday and will begin presenting early next week. This week in EL we have also been completing released reading EOG passages. Mr. T also continued completing MClass testing with our students. This should be completed next week.

<u>Social Studies/Science</u>: In science this week, our students have been reviewing content for our upcoming science EOG. Students reviewed concepts including forces and motion, heat transfer, and chemical and physical changes. We will continue to review science concepts next week.
