

Hello Sycamore Creek Families, It is that time of year again when we will be giving our 3rd-5th grade students their End of Grade (EOG) tests. Testing will take place in May (Track 1) and June (Tracks 2, 3 and 4). In order for testing to run smoothly we need help from volunteers like you to proctor! The more volunteer proctors we get the fewer teacher assistants, specialists, and teachers we have to pull from classes to proctor. In order to proctor you will need to be a registered volunteer, attend a brief training at school, and be able to be at school from 8:30-12:00 on the days you sign up to proctor. 
EOG Dates

Curriculum Update

<u>Math</u>: Students have been working hard this week reviewing concepts for the math EOG. We began the week completing task cards related to geometry and measurement. Then for the remainder of the week we have been taking notes about decimals and fractions. We have also been completing word problems, quizizz, and playing games relating fractions and decimals. We will continue to review for our math EOG through next week.

Reading: In reading this week, the students practiced some reading EOG passages. You will find these practice opportunities in your child's Friday folder. This week we have upped our amount of passages per sitting to 3 passages to build stamina. We have also continued to read the the Westing Game. Our students have seemed to enjoy the mystery and humorous aspects of this novel. In writing, students are continuing to write their own research papers. Many students have chosen some interesting topic. Ask your student about their research topic.

Science: In science this week, students have begun reviewing for the science EOG on Monday. Students reviewed information relating to our earlier study ecosystems and motion and design. Students were provided study guides for the units we have studied this year. Students also reviewed by completing several quizizz and jeopardy games. I am really proud of our students and they should be proud of themselves as well. Students need to make sure they take their time on Monday, and select the best answer from the situations described on the test.

OBJECTIVES



I Can Statements:

I Can... In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with your student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

• convert measurements within a given system.

Reading:

• analyze multiple accounts of the same topic noting similarities and differences in the views they represent.

Writing:

write xplanatory

explanatory/informational texts to examine or convey ideas about a topic clearly.

Science

• explain how cold and warm fronts affect daily weather

Explain air masses and the impact it has on daily weather patterns.
