<u>Math</u>: We continued our graphing unit this week. Students engaged in investigations related to numerical patterns. They determined the value of x and y coordinates, patterns and relationships between ordered pairs. Most of our class has mastered interpreting graphs and can plot ordered pairs on a plane. However, determining pattern rules is an area some of us need to work on. This will continue to be a focus for us and students have also been practicing this on homework. So, please review these pages that came home in their Friday folder. We complete our first assessment next week.

<u>Reading:</u> We continued learning all about the Universal Declaration of Human Rights. Students have been exposed to the Criteria for an Effective Summary and were provided a framework that can assist them when writing summaries. This can be found in your child's "EL" section of the binder. This week, your child was given two different homework assignments where they were practicing quoting accurately from the text. We reviewed the expectation for this and most students have a better understanding of how to do this. Please ask them about this. We continued reading <u>Esperanza</u> <u>Rising</u> and identifying threats to Human Rights. Students seem to really enjoy this unit and are gaining an understanding of theirs' and others' rights.

<u>Social Studies</u>: Our budget unit continued this week. Students learned about taxes and how local and federal governments use this money to pay for various items within their state/community. They were given an assignment to allocate a certain percentage to categories in their community. After they decided how much to allot each section, they created a Google Sheet and converted their data into graph. On Thursday, they learned about different types of economies. They created bracelets to reinforce the style of each economy. Be on the lookout for their first assessment in next week's Friday folder.
