<u>Math</u>: At the beginning of the week, the students took their end of unit assessment on coordinate grids, graphing and patterns. Your child's assessment should be in his/her Friday folder this week. On Tuesday, we started our new unit which will cover the concept of volume. We began exploring strategies to determine the volume of a rectangular prism without using a formula. The class discovered that volume can be found by simply counting the snap cubes, finding the total snap cubes for a layer and multiply that number by the number of letters and a few even figured out that the $1 \times w \times h$ will also give the volume for a rectangular prism.

<u>Reading:</u> This week in reading the students took their mid unit 1 assessment. They will have this assessment back in next week's Friday folder. On Tuesday, the students listened to a read aloud of the chapter Los Melones from "Esperanza Rising". On Wednesday, students prepared for a mock text based discussion answering the following question "How were the human rights of the characters in chapters 1-3 threatened?" On Thursday, they completed their note catcher for the text based discussion assessment. On Friday, the students completed Part 2 of the text based discussion by explaining how Chapter 6 fits into the overall plot structure and answering two short response questions.

<u>Social Studies/Science</u>: In social studies this week we continued our study of the United States government took notes on the three branches of government in order to prepare for their 2nd assessment. Later in the week, the students were introduced to the Declaration of Independence. Ask them all about the 'break up' letter I found on the floor in class ⁽³⁾.

I Can Statements:

Math:

I can determine the volume of a rectangular prism using multiple strategies.

I can explain how ideas of various governments (Roman, Greek, Iroquois, and British) influenced the development of the United States government.
