Curriculum Update

Math: We spent the first part of the week wrapping up our graphing unit with multiple practices plotting points on a coordinate grid that corresponded with "change over time" data. On Wednesday, they took their first math test which tested more than just their understanding of graphing as the mental stamina required for it was a lot. These will take me some time to grade, so be on the lookout for your child's score in next week's Friday folder. On Thursday, we began our volume unit. I was able to get donations of popcorn which will be used for a future lesson. Thank you to all of you who helped me with that!

Reading: Our book study of Esperanza Rising and Threat's to Human Rights continued this week. Students completed their end of unit assessment on Wednesday. On Monday and Tuesday they prepared for the first part of this test by completing a "Text Based Discussion" Note Catcher. They were divided into groups of 5 for the discussion assessment. This is a new way for them to demonstrate their understanding and it challenged all of us to step out of our comfort zone. On Thursday, we began our 2nd unit with this novel. Students are learning how to write a character response paragraph. Be sure to ask them all about what they are learning. Earlier this week, they were introduced to a new text, "A Life Like Mine: How Children live around the World." This has helped them develop insight and appreciation for how others live their lives.

Social Studies: The students' first economics assessment was graded and should be in your child's Friday folder. I'm still getting some students caught up on this, so if your child's is not in his/her folder it's likely unfinished. This week, they learned about various economic systems with our beaded bracelet business. Be sure to ask them which economy was their favorite. On Tuesday, they watched two videos on assembly lines. On Wednesday and Thursday we studied scarcity, supply and demand, and natural resources.

OBJECTIVES



I Can Statements:

I Can... In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with your student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

- I can create a line plot to display data sets.
- I can understand how to graph ordered pairs on a coordinate plane.
- I can use numerical rules and patterns to form ordered pairs.

Reading:

- I can quote accurately from a text when explaining what the text says explicitly and when drawing inferences from the text.
- I can explain how a series of chapters, scenes of stanzas fit together to create a larger literary text.

Social Studies:

• I can explain the importance of budgeting and saving.
