
# MR.T's ROCKINGS

# **Curriculum Update**

<u>Math</u>: In math this week, we continued to explore the world of division. Students practiced making estimates of the quotient by rounding the divisor. Their understanding of base 10 multiplication helped them make reasonable estimates for their quotient. Students also received practice dividing by 2 digit divisors using a strategy of their choice. On Tuesday, students were introduced to Moby Max. They completed their placement test and began practicing individualized skills based on their results. This resource will be used frequently in class and for homework. Please ask your child to share it with you.

Reading: In reading this week, we completed all of our initial MClass reading assessments. Students were assessed on oral reading fluency, accuracy, and their ability to retell what occurred in the text. Next week, students will begin their reading strategy groups with Mr. T. Our mini lessons this week focused on inferencing and asking questions while we read so that we can gain a deeper sense of the plot and characters of the stories we read. Students completed an inferencing lesson on Moby Max as well as a paper, pencil assessment on this skill. You will find written test in your child's Friday folder next week.

\*Reading Logs this year will require students to read 25 minutes every night. This will be completed on the Honor System. You will not need to turn any documentation into me. Please make sure your child is setting this time aside every night.

**Writing**: In writing this week, we began crafting our drafts for our narrative writing pieces. Students were provided several mini lessons and strategies about crafting well written, detailed introductions. Students were also shown a copy of our narrative writing rubric found <a href="here">here</a>. We then reviewed questions and information about writing conferences and provided a modeled conference with myself and a student in front of the class.

Science: In Science this week we continued to work on our study of Motion and Design. We finished our investigations of motion relating to pulley systems and washers by completing a design challenge. Students had to create a vehicle that carried two heavy blocks that represented moon rocks. Students were tasked at moving their vehicle a certain distance within 4-6 seconds. Students worked in teams to decide the number of washers that were needed on the pulley system to move their vehicle. After completing this project we discussed potential and kinetic energy and started a new investigation with our vehicle involving rubber band energy. Next week, students will continue our study of motion and energy and our students will learn about how motion data can be graphed. Science vocabulary can be studied and accessed here.
