# **Curriculum Update**

Math: In math this week, the students began their fifth grade curriculum. We began the week by discussing categorical and numerical data. Students sorted various survey questions to determine if the responses would provide numerical or categorical data. We then read a short story entitled "Sir Cumference and the Viking's Map". This story provided students with a back story of plotting points on a coordinate grid. Next, we practiced forming and plotting ordered pairs on a line graph. Students should be careful when creating their graphs to make sure the numbers on the axis are lined up properly. We will continue our examination of line graphs next week.

Reading: This week in reading we began our first 5th grade EL module which relates to Human Rights. Students viewed various text excerpts, videos, and documents to infer our topic of human rights. Next we began reading our novel for the first quarter, "Esperanza Rising". We read the first several chapters and researched the history of Mexico in 1924, while paying close attention to the Mexican government and social revolution of the time period. We also noted the plot structure and gist of each chapter. Thus far, our three chapters are part of the exposition and rising action. In all block, students began learning about each of the tasks they would be completing during our all block time.

<u>Social Studies/Science</u>: In social studies this week we began our first quarter unit on the United States government. Students reviewed various articles on earlier governments and the influence they had on the formation of the US government.

### **OBJECTIVES**



#### I Can Statements:
