Curriculum Update

Math: This week our students have continued their study of volume. We formalized our calculation of volume by introducing the algorithm length x width x height. Students solved various real world volume problems in small groups and took part in a popcorn prism activity. Students created two rectangular prisms with the same size sheets of computer paper. After folding the paper in different ways we filled one prism with popcorn. Next, we placed the other empty prism around the outside of the filled prism. Students then predicted which prism would hold more popcorn. Finally we removed the prism full of popcorn that allowed the popcorn to flow into the other prism. Our students were amazed to see that the shorter wider prism held more popcorn. Afterwards we calculated the actual volume to see the difference in volumes.

Reading: This week in reading we read several more chapters of our story "Esperanza Rising". Students furthered reviewed the human rights that were threatened within the chapters. Our main focus this week was examining character reactions to various events. We began by discussing major events that occurred and determined that for the chapter "Las Almendras" the most significant event was mama and Esperanza moving into their small work camp cabin. Our students and Mr. T co-wrote a reaction paragraph based upon Eserpanza's reaction after reviewing the EL provided paragraph. Students then wrote another reaction paragraph with a partner about how the characters responded to Mama's illness.

<u>Social Studies/Science</u>: In social studies this week we continued our study of the United States government. Students further examined kid friendly versions of the Declaration of Independence and we reviewed the weaknesses of our first government that was created by the Articles of Confederation.
