

Nominations for Academically or
Intellectually Gifted Evaluation:

Parents/Guardians of fourth or fifth grade students may nominate their child to be considered for evaluation for the Academically or Intellectually Gifted Program. Nominations for fall testing are due by August 6th for tracks 1 and 2 and September 4th for tracks 3 and 4. All nominations must be in writing and may be returned to Mrs. Hochbrueckner (tracks 2 and 4) or Mrs. Chambliss (tracks 1 and 3) via email or the classroom teacher. When you request an evaluation, please include your child's name, grade, track, and homeroom teacher. Curriculum Update

Math: In Math this week we began our first unit of the year, "Creating Classroom Community through Graphing". To begin we discussed various types of data including numerical data, categorical data, and data that changes over time. We spent time sorting various survey question answers into one of the aforementioned categories. Next, we briefly reviewed plotting points on a coordinate grid and began learning about graphing with collected numerical data. Students caught onto this fairly quickly. Over the next several days we will continue discussing graphing and students will complete an in class graphing poster.

Reading: In Reading we began our new curriculum, EL. Students inferred our new unit of study, human rights by reviewing documents and materials around the room. We also reviewed discussion norms which will be very important for our students to follow when we are working collaboratively. Next, we began our book study "Esperanza Rising". Students got a basic gist of the story and completed some informational research on the location (Mexico) of our story. We also spent some time this week reviewing the rotations we will be doing during our "All Block" time. On Friday we practiced our independent reading by following some guidelines of what "close" readers do. We will be continuing our study of human rights for the next few weeks.

<u>Social Studies</u>: We started the year with Social Studies and we will begin science in about 3 weeks. In Social Studies this quarter we will be learning about economies. To begin the unit we began learning about budgeting and saving while completing 2 nearpod activities. Next, we practiced creating budgets and completed several budgeting assignments in class. Next we will discuss how budgets are made on a large scale with an activity entitled "the President's Budget".
