Curriculum Update

<u>Math</u>: In math this week, the students summoned their 4th grade knowledge of Base 10 and multi-digit multiplication. The students also reviewed the area model and the standard algorithm making connections between both of these multiplication strategies. Be sure to ask your child all about this over the weekend. On Friday, the class worked on an Open House activity that provided them with continued practice.

<u>Reading</u>: In reading we discussed strategies good readers use in order to dig deeper into the text they are reading. Many students shared how making predictions and asking questions specifically to the text can be helpful too. However, we discussed how general questions such as "how does the author's words evoke an image in our head?" can cross over and apply to many different texts. This sparked interesting conversation about how we can analyze character development and theme as well. The class will receive their first vocabulary list next week. Their word study activities will be introduced next week. In Writing, we began talking about narrative writing stories. Students completed brainstorming writing activities and prewriting to access our prior knowledge. They also completed their first writing prompt in which they were to write a letter to their end of year self.

Social Studies: This week the students learned about economics. They completed their first nearpod activity to better learn about trade off and opportunity cost. At the end of the week, they watched a brain pop video on budget and completed their own budget analyzing needs and wants which encouraged the importance of being a smart spender. Be sure to ask them all about how they plan to move forward with spending and saving now that they have learned all about it in class!
