

Curriculum Update



<u>Math</u> – In Math this week we continued to discuss numerical expressions, equations, and the order of operations. On Tuesday, students created "graffiti" art with words and phrases to display their understanding of the order of operations. On Wednesday, students played an expression matching game in which students reviewed the word form and numerical form of various equations. We then compared and contrasted similar equations without solving the equations. On Thursday, we compared and contrasted more equations in small groups and then discussed our findings using a method called the traveling file. This method allows students to critique or confirm other groups' findings and then pass the file to another group. On Friday, we took a short quiz displaying our understanding of the order of operations. Be on the lookout for this in next week's Friday folder.

<u>Reading</u> – In Reading this week we began studying a new genre, fantasy. Students were very excited to begin this unit. We began the week by reading various fantasy picture books noting things that could happen in real life and things that could not happen in real life. Next, we began reading the novel, "Mrs. Frisby and the Rats of Nimh". This book will be utilized in whole class lessons and literature circles throughout the third quarter. On Thursday, we reviewed possible characteristics of fantasy stories, including the unique plots, settings, characters, and lessons that make fantasies unique. Then we read an excerpt of the story "Peter and Wendy" as a class, highlighting the elements that made the story fantasy. Be sure to ask your students about this new fantastical journey that we are taking as a class!

<u>Writing</u> – In Writing, just as in reading we began discussing writing fantasy stories. Students previewed various fantasy picture books on Wednesday getting an idea of the elements present within the fantasy genre. On Thursday and Friday, students began drafting stories using wordless picture books. Students utilized an organizational framework and graphic organizer to begin putting words to our wordless fantasy picture books. Students worked in small groups and individually to let their imagination come to life.

<u>Science</u> – In Science this week we began our new unit, Ecosystems. We began on Wednesday by creating terrariums using 2 – liter bottles and planting three types of seeds. These terrariums will hold various organisms including, isopods, crickets, mustard plants, rye grass, and alfalfa plants. We also observed an ecosystem illustration and discussed how ecosystems are interconnected because they rely on numerous living and nonliving things.

<u>CHOMPliment</u> – With the extended break/track out and snow days I was expecting our class to have a little bit harder of a time coming back and getting into the swing of our daily school schedule. At times I was right, students needed some added guidance and redirection when walking in the halls and focusing during class lessons. If you could talk to your student about school CHOMPing expectations as I have, it would greatly appreciated!



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I Can...

In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with our student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

I can use parentheses and brackets in expressions.

I can write expressions I hear using mathematic symbols and the order of operations.

Reading:

I can explain how a series of chapters, scenes of stanzas fit together to create a larger literary text.

Writing:

Write narratives to develop real or imagined experiences or events using effective technique, descriptive details, and clear event sequences.

Science:

Understand the interdependence of plants and animals and their ecosystems.

Explain how some materials change as a result of heating and cooling.
