Courage

Curriculum Update

<u>Math</u>: On Thursday and Friday of this week we continued discussing coordinate grids and ordered pairs. Students worked through various activities and they learned to graph information relating to rates of change. On Friday, students took a math assessment relating to geometry and coordinate grids. Look for this assessment to come home with your student in next week's Friday folder after it is reviewed with the class. Please see the following links as a preview of upcoming content in math.

<u>Reading:</u> On Thursday, we began discussing how different informational texts are organized using various structures. A text's "structure", is in essence how the material is organized. The text structures we will be discussing this week and next week include: sequence, chronological order, compare and contrast, cause and effect, problem and solution, and description. Text structures will continue to be an area of focus next week.

<u>Writing</u>: On Thursday and Friday of this week students began editing and publishing our milk debate opinion writing pieces. We also continued to discuss the importance between balancing the evidence with explanations. Without this, students found their writing to be less engaging and very 'list like.' I encourage you to ask your child to share what they have accomplished thus far on this assignment. We will complete and turn in this assignment next week.

<u>Science:</u> On Thursday, the students were given a quick formative assessment using a web based program called Plickers. The results suggested that the majority of the class has grasped how the concepts from the 2nd mini unit. On Friday, the students took their 2nd quiz which covered the water cycle, cloud formation and evaporation/condensation. This will be graded and ready for next week's Friday folder. On Monday, we will be moving into your next mini unit which will focus on air pressure and weather fronts.

<u>Chomp Update:</u> I am very pleased with our students' chomping abilities within the school and during our DC field trip. Our tour guides had only positive remarks for our class and the other fifth grade students. Our class voted upon our Chomp Reward and selected campfire read. This event will take place one day next week.

I Can...

In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with our student by discussing the following statements.

Math:

Identify various attributes of a 2D shape.

Create a hierarchy tree or diagram to show the relationship between polygons and various other shapes.

Graph and interpret ordered pairs in the first quadrant.

Reading:

Quote accurately when explaining a nonfiction text.


Use tracking symbols and notes to monitor what I've read in a nonfiction text.

Science:

Understand weather patterns and phenomena, making connections to the weather in a particular place and time.

Understand the interactions of matter and energy and the changes that occur.

Explain how the properties of some materials change as a result of heating and cooling.
