# Curriculum Update

**Math** – In Math this week we continued our instruction and learning of adding and subtracting decimals. Students began the week using concrete models and on Tuesday we began discussing how the concrete models connected to the standard algorithm. At the end of the week we started completing a project in which students had to purchase items from grocery stores to create a detailed food menu for a week. Next week, students will continue adding and subtracting decimals and they will finish and present their grocery excursion projects. This <u>video</u> illustrates the concrete modeling methods we have been utilizing in class. <u>Acceleration</u> – We will soon be discussing 2-D figures. Begin reviewing attributes and terms with your students <u>here</u>. Also review this parent <u>document</u> provided by WCPSS.

**Social Studies –** In Social Studies this week we continued discussing the area of economics. Students learned about interdependence and how countries rely on one another for resources. To further enhance this understanding we completed several role playing scenarios where students had to trade goods and natural resources with other countries (groups of students). On Thursday and Friday students sold and bought goods from one another and learned how fluctuations in the supply and demand of a product with either increase or decrease the cost of the product. Students also were able to visualize how their personal business decisions could have a financial impact on their earnings. While completing this project students filled out a budget that detailed their income and expenditures. Next week we will be wrapping up our unit on economics by reviewing and completing an assessment of our overall understanding of economics.

**Reading** – In reading this week, we continued our study of characters. We spent this week looking at specific characters from our stories and compared and contrasted how they interacted with other characters. We also compared and contrasted how they responded to trials in the story. To gain further insight about characters we continued to utilize the book "Tiger Rising". When we began to compare our characters and how they responded to challenges we noticed that our two main characters, Sistine and Rob, respond to challenges they face in entirely different fashions. By further examining how the characters of a story compare and contrast we are able to gain a far deeper understanding of a text and the message the author is attempting to convey. Discuss this story with your student and ask them about their thinking regarding the many characters and how they compare. This was also an area that we focused on in our reading and strategy groups. **Acceleration** – Review this concept map created with Prezi (located here) to see the overview of our unit on theme. By reviewing and discussing this concept map with your student you will see the larger picture of what we are accomplishing in Language Arts.

**Writing** - In writing we began the week by continuing to work on our narrative writing. Students were provided a <u>narrative writing rubric</u>. Throughout the week, we completed mini lessons relating to adding dialogue, completing introductions, and crafting conclusion paragraphs. We worked through the writing process and published our final drafts in our own neat handwriting.

# I Can...

In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with our student by discussing the following statements.

# <u>Math</u>

I can add and subtract decimals using concrete models and the standard algorithm.

# **Reading**

Discuss how characters respond to challenges and change throughout the story.

Determine the theme using details from a literary text.


I can compare and contrast literary elements using details from the text (two or more characters' points of view, settings, events).
