Curriculum Update



Math – In Math this week we continued our instruction and learning of adding and subtracting decimals. Students began the week continuing their grocery excursion project. Students worked as a group completing their menu for their group and an imaginary set of grandparents. Students were encouraged to complete their list under budget while creating a well-balanced menu of items. On Thursday, students finalized their presentations and completed their quiz relating to adding and subtracting decimals. This video illustrates the concrete modeling methods we have been utilizing in class. Acceleration – We will soon be discussing 2-D figures. Begin reviewing attributes and terms with your students here. Also review this parent document provided by WCPSS.

Social Studies – In Social Studies this week we continued discussing the topic of economics. Students learned about importing and exporting and discussed how countries rely on one another for resources. We reviewed concepts from our buying and selling of goods experience last week. We then began a social studies economic <u>project</u> in small groups. Students researched economic policies and trade partners with the US during a specific period of history (i.e. WWII, the Great Depression). We completed the week by displaying our overall understanding of this social studies unit by completing an assessment. Next week we will be wrapping up our unit on economics by finishing our social studies group projects and presenting our findings.

Reading – In reading this week, we continued our study of characters and began discussing summarization. We began Monday, comparing and contrasting characters and how they responded to the same events differently. Next, we began discussing summaries by identifying key details and events from our read aloud stories. Then we discussed how to formulate a short concise 2-3 sentences that described the overall essence of the story. Finally, students took time for independent practice by reading short paragraphs and constructing their own summaries. In small groups this week we read a short story titled *Grandpa Smoke Jumper*. Students compared characters within the story and created a summary of each section. **Acceleration** – Review this concept map created with Prezi (located here) to see the overview of our unit on theme. By reviewing and discussing this concept map with your student you will see the larger picture of what we are accomplishing in Language Arts.

Writing - In writing we began the week by discussing our final narrative drafts. We celebrated our completion of our writing by having narrative free writing time. Students also spent several writing sessions reviewing summarization and working on summarizing various texts that were read aloud.

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I Can...

In order to bring purpose to what your child is learning, we post I CAN statements on our board daily. It is important that your child is continually utilizing these to evaluate their understanding. You can check in with

our student by discussing the following statements.

Math

I can add and subtract decimals using concrete models and the standard algorithm.

Reading

Discuss how characters respond to challenges and change throughout the story.

Determine the theme using details from a literary text.

I can compare and contrast literary elements using details from the text (two or more characters' points of view, settings, events).

I can summarize a literary text.

Social Studies

Understand how countries rely on another for goods and services.
